SANTA FE TOUR

Thursday, September 24

Sit back and enjoy the trip to Santa Fe, via the Turquoise Trail. Wind along the east side of the Sandia Mountains and through the revived ghost towns and mining towns of Madrid and Golden. Founded in 1610, Santa Fe is the site of the oldest continuously operated community building in the United States. Private homes, public buildings, even gas stations are adobe or stucco plastered. Your guide will conduct a walking tour of the historic section of Santa Fe including a stop at San Miguel Mission and also Loretto Chapel Museum, site of the miraculous Staircase. Following the tour enjoy lunch on your own in one of the many local restaurants and browse the shops and galleries.

**SANDIA TRAMWAY &
NATIONAL MUSEUM OF NUCLEAR
SCIENCE AND HISTORY**

Friday, September 25

Armed with a snack bag for the day, we head for the Sandia Peak Tramway and a ride on the world's longest aerial tram. You will glide from the desert floor for 2.7 miles to the peak at 10,378 feet in this fifteen-minute ride. The panoramic view from the top will cover all of Albuquerque and beyond. There will be time to look at the displays and gift shop at the top before returning. You may want to bring a light jacket; it could be cool at the top. Next, tour the National Atomic Museum, where the complete history of U.S. nuclear development unfolds around you. Prominently featured is the Manhattan Project, the sophisticated scientific engineering effort centered in New Mexico that developed, produced, and tested the first atomic bomb. Continue with the tour, which will include old Route 66, the Country Club area, the University of New Mexico campus, and a stop at West Mesa for a panoramic view of the city.

INDIAN PUEBLO CULTURAL CENTER

Saturday, September 26

Indian Pueblo Cultural Center is the preeminent place to discover the history, culture, and art of the 19 Pueblos of New Mexico. They house thousands of rare artifacts including a world-renowned collection of historic and contemporary Pueblo pottery, as well as baskets, weaving, painting, murals, jewelry, and photographs. Saturday includes Traditional Indian Dances and artist demonstrations. Lunch on your own at Pueblo Harvest, a full-service restaurant and bakery known for its extraordinary New Native American Cuisine, which incorporates traditional Pueblo flavors into contemporary cooking.
